As the world moves indoors, Animal Crossing: New Horizons has become not only a source of entertainment but a beautiful moment of escapism. What is Animal Crossing: New Horizons? Animal Crossing: New Horizons is the latest edition of the Animal Crossing series from Nintendo. Made for the Nintendo Switch, this is the fifth game in the series and takes place on a desert island. The game places you, a human character with customizable features, on a deserted island with animal neighbors, apple trees and a starter tent. There is no specific objective and there are no monsters to fight, the game simply allows you to exist. You can spend your time fishing, bug-catching, building Flimsy Axes, searching for iron nuggets, or decorating your home. As you explore the island, earn miles and clocks (the island's currency) that allow you to expand your Animal Crossing world and try new things like planting a garden and building a house (with a customizable roof color!). What do you need to play? To play Animal Crossing: New Horizons with all the bells and whistles, you'll need a Nintendo Switch, Animal Crossing: New Horizons game, an internet connection and a Nintendo Switch Online subscription (there's a seven-day free trial, so you can test before you buy. The game is playable without internet and a Nintendo subscription, but you'll miss some of the key features. You can play the game both on your handheld Switch or Switch Lite or connected to your TV. Can you play with friends? Yes! And this is the best part! As long as you have an internet connection and a Nintendo Switch Online subscription, you can travel through the airport to your friends' islands. You can also send mail to your friends if you feel like staying. Own a piece of paradise As usual, Tom Nook's proposal for your vacation in Animal Crossing: New Horizons seems a bit sketchy — and this time takes the form of a pseudo-timeshare. A trailer released in January 2020 features Nook and his staff pitching a Deserted Island Getaway Package to the game's characters showing the available customization and creation options. It also gives us a look at the game's box art, which you can see at the end of the video above. A Nintendo Direct presentation from February 2020 also revealed that players will be able to choose from several island configurations. They have different routes and options, and players can also decide whether to live in the northern or southern hemisphere regardless of their actual location. Once the island is selected, players can still use NookPhone to change up the topography as they like, including adding or removing rocks and rivers. Bridges and slopes are buildable as well, to make it easier to get across the island. That customization also extends to the game options. The camera can be adjusted to a top-down angle similar to the first game on the GameCube, which can be more fun for those playing on switch lite or with their system in handheld mode. The NookPhone is customizable too, so anyone can express themselves with their own case patterns. Put your feet up Animal Crossing: New Horizons is available as a product of Tom Nook's Nook Inc., which has created The Deserted Island Getaway Package as your latest holiday destination. You will be able to camp, complete with a tent and fire, grow plants, clear resources from trees and or just relax on the beach after a particularly long day. When you start, all you will have inside your tent is a foldable cot, a lamp and a radio. As in Happy Home Designer, you will be able to move things in your home in half-units. The deserted island is yours to decorate and customize as you see fit, and you can create your dream house on the property. If you want to put furniture outside, it's also an option, because no city regulation can stop you. Of course, since this holiday package is Tom Nook's idea, you can expect him to knock within too long and demand that you repay any loans you have taken out. However, you'll also get rewarded with Nook Miles for milestones you complete in the game, which can be spent on items and activities. According to an interview with the development team at E3 2019, the decision to put the game on the island rooted in offering players a new experience — one where they don't start in a pre-existing village. The DIY Recipe Crafting system has been significantly expanded in Animal Crossing: New Horizons. Called DIY Recipes, the new system allows you to create a variety of items using gutted materials such as tree branches, clay, hardwood and stone. You can make tools to help you in your adventures, signs, water jugs, benches, and even drinks. The recipes are conveniently placed in an app on your in-game phone. Because there are so many to choose from and because there is such a wide range of materials to use for crafting, the weeds or other junk items you discover while exploring can actually be used to make new goodies. You can visit Tom Nook's workbench and then turn them into new tools for free. If you eat an apple from a tree, it can even give you energy to the garden faster. To get new DIY Recipes, you have three main options. Some other animals will give you recipes for free, and you can learn recipes by finding items on the island. If you really need a specific recipe and can't figure out another option, you can also buy them from stores. There are customization options for furniture as well. The color can be changed, and special patterns are available to add extra feel. These can be combined, for example, with a bed, so the bedding is a design and the frame color changes separately. The Four Seasons Clock plays a big role in Animal Crossing: New Horizons, as it is connected to your own watch in the real world. There is both a northern hemisphere area and southern hemisphere options to better match your own location, and the season will change throughout the year. This brings new activities, such as

rolling snowballs in winter, and completely changes the look of your island. If you play in June in the northern hemisphere, it will be sunny, but those who choose the southern hemisphere option will be in the middle of winter. The wind can change the speeds of the island, and this will be expressed by how the leaves move on trees. The wildlife you find varies during the season. If you fish in winter, you may end up finding many different varieties than you did in the warmer seasons. In the summer, more bugs will come across, and cicadas can be heard making loud noises in the February 2020 Nintendo Direct presentation. Because Nintendo wants gamers to avoid rewinding or otherwise changing time, Animal Crossing: New Horizons will not be compatible with cloud saves. Play together One of the apps you will discover on your mobile phone inside New Horizons is called Call an Islander. With the help of this app you can choose to play with another person in local cooperative mode. Those who also have a house on the island — the game has an island per Switch system, so you'll share — are eligible to join. You only need one Joy-Con controller per player, so two people can enjoy the game together without any other equipment. Up to eight players can share an island, and up to four can play together at the same time. All players can be made leaders of a party, which is denoted by a flag over his head. This player will have control over where you and the camera move while playing together. There will also be local wireless and online multiplayer options. When playing in this way, up to eight players can gather on a player's island and complete activities together. To invite someone else from a separate island, players must go to the airport. It opens up the day after arrival on the island, and it is also available to travel to someone else's island, and to send messages via post. Once players have earned enough Nook Miles, they can purchase Nook Miles tickets to travel to separate islands and collect rewards. These will differ every time, and are effectively mysteries until they arrive. Everything found can be taken home, including materials and animals. But save data secure Animal Crossing: New Horizons launches along with a special edition Switch console, but players interested in buying it will want to pick it up before they start the game on a separate console. The game's box art states that it does not support save transfers, which means that the island you start on a console will only be compatible with that console — sort of. After launch, players will be able to transfer their savings data to a second system via a dedicated service. This will only be possible in the case of a defective or lost system, and it can only be done once. If problems occur a second time, this data will be gone forever. A wonderful new Nintendo Switch For those who get their first Nintendo Switch system or a second for their home, Nintendo has made an Animal Crossing: New Horizons special-edition console. The console releases on March 13, just before the game's launch, and contains the series' emblems and icons along the entire system casing. The console comes with a special Animal Crossing dock, as well as light blue and light green Getting Even Better Animal Crossing: Crossing: Horizons will receive additional updates to improve the game after launch, including seasonal events. A special Bunny Day event will come in April, and those who play Animal Crossing: Pocket Camp can get special items in the two games. The game also supports Amiibo characters and cards, and characters you scan with the Joy-Con controller will appear on your island. When can we play it?
